

THE DETAIL

LOCATION

LLANFROTHEN, is a village and a parish in the county of Gwynedd, Wales, between the towns of Porthmadog and Blaenau Ffestiniog. People visit Llanfrothen to enjoy peaceful, unspoilt surroundings where natural beauty is abundant and photo opportunities lurk around every corner. While there are popular tourist attractions nearby - for example, the Glaslyn Osprey Project at nearby Pont Croesor (handily located near the station for a trip on the Welsh Highland Railway), and Portmeirion, just down the road at Minffordd - the real delight in Llanfrothen and Croesor is just being there, soaking up the peaceful atmosphere and beautiful surroundings. The Ring (the local name for The Brondanw Arms) is a great place to do this.

TRADING


The Bryondanwn has three trading areas. The main bar has a slate floor and wood burner in a large fireplace, the seating comprises of pews and window benches and the ceiling is adorned with old farm tools. There are 11 pumps on the bar, with Guinness being a big seller. To the right of the bar there is a snug, known as the parlour bar that has panelled booths with seating for up to 20 people. This is a popular area as it is very warm and inviting with its ornate potbelly stove. To the rear there is a long spacious dining room with panoramic views of the Snowdonia National Park, currently offering great home-cooked food. The toilets are located down a staircase that also leads out to the garden, with views of Snowdonia National Park.

PRIVATE

The accommodation consists of two double bedrooms, one with fitted wardrobes, one with a fitted cupboard, plus one single bedroom. There is an outside seating area on a terrace that overlooks the gardens and has the benefit of a terrace and beautiful views. There is a lounge, bathroom and small kitchen and a storage area to the front of the property with a spacious office leading from it.
